What's one of them?



An Individual Service Fund (ISF) is an arrangement where the Council transfers the money agreed for a person's care and support arrangements to an organisation of their choice, which can be their current care provider if that's what the person wants.

The key is an ISF means that the person can be in control of how their support is designed and delivered.

The care provider works with the person to plan care and support services and activities.

Who is this session for?
