

Directed by Yurii Radionov and performed by Shorena Shoniia, known for her work in film (*No Step Back*, *Secret Love*) and theatre (*Juliet and Romeo*, *Lesya Ukrainka Theatre*), who skilfully works with each story to reveal the full range of emotions of a woman in an inhuman war: a girl, sister, mother, friend, wife, neighbour, grandmother. Raped, mutilated, killed... but unconquered! These are stories of strong and loving women who will cross hundreds of roads and lead their children to their land – UKRLAND, where there will be no evil. And there will be a strong spirit, culture and love.

UKRLAND is a compelling theatre production created in response to the war in Ukraine and commissioned by the Lowry, Salford. Their work showcases brand-new texts from members of the Ukrainian Playwrights Theatre that share the very real, human experiences that so many are facing at the moment in Ukraine.



Meet Lancashire Refugee Integration Team (LRIT)

Many people talk about “who is Refugee?”. From my point of view, as a refugee who suffered and experienced difficulties in being herself, and achieving her dreams, a refugee is a human; a human who is homeless, dreamless, who has had a distance put between their family and themselves, who is far away from a hug.

Refugees are fleeing from a range of different situations such as conflict, human rights abuses, environmental disasters, or other crises. In Syria, where I am from, a war has led to the displacement of millions of people, caused widespread destruction of infrastructure and buildings, and resulted in the loss of hundreds of thousands of lives. I was forced to move from my country and try to adjust, starting everything from the beginning again, trying to build myself again. We are a young generation who grew up so fast, who left their dreams in a small box which has been locked with a key that the war took.

It was through the Syrian Resettlement Programme that I came to the UK. This scheme was a new road for my family and myself. This road gave us two options; being able to unlock the little box to make all our dreams come true but this comes at a price. The price is being away from our family again in a new country trying to adjust to everything new for the ten thousandth time. But if we chose to reject this pathway, we would lose this key and even the box, and will be living the rest of our days without thinking of tomorrow.

My name is Yuliia Yevushko, and I come from Kyiv, Ukraine. I arrived in the UK as a refugee on the Homes for Ukraine Scheme in August 2022. Now I am working as a Business Support Officer in Lancashire County Council, and I am happy to be part of Lancashire Refugee Integration Team.

I am extremely grateful to the British People for opening their homes for Ukrainians and providing us not only with safe places to live but also for appreciating our skills and experience. Straight after my arrival I applied to many different companies

hoping to get a job since I wanted to integrate to the system, be independent and contribute my energy and skills to the society. At one of the meetings of Ukrainian Hub in Lancaster I met Rebecca and Mary from LRIT, and we quickly realised that we were on the same wavelength.

I applied, and was successful at interview, to become part of the team which changed my life a lot and made it more meaningful. Every day I communicate with people who are sacrificing their private lives to support refugees and make their wellbeing comfortable. I am happy to be involved and I do my best to perform well and meet my mentors' expectations.

In Ukraine I worked as a managing director in the NHS and the skills I brought from this role, of working with vulnerable people, help me in my job now. Moreover, after fleeing the war I spent three months in the Czech Republic where I volunteered in the refugee Centre Mriya. This experience has changed my life priorities and goals completely. Now I understand that the most important things for people are peace and freedom. And the best way to heal yourself is to help other people in their struggle.
