FRIENDS OF WILLIAMSON PARK

After receiving a grant from EMCOR, the Friends have been restoring and improving the orchard in Fenham Carr. This has included creating a flat path, planting a hedge along the track (thanks to the Woodland Trust Community Trees), coppicing and will plant four new fruit trees.

LDGS have been made aware that fruit has been picked from community green spaces well before the fruit is ripe and on one occasion, all the fruit has disappeared in one go over night. Please could you let us know if this has happened in your green space, so we can ascertain how wide spread the issue is. Thank you!



CLAVER HILL

There will be a fruit tree grafting session soon. We have a lot of frog spawn at Claver Hill. Herons are apparently coming to feed on it!



HAPPY HEDGING

Winter was the time for planting trees and shrubs, hedgelaying and dead hedging.

FAIRFIELD ASSOCIATION VOLUNTEERS 36 volunteers planted 1070 saplings of 16 species to create a hedge and spinneys to increase species diversity in West Field.

SKILLS SWAP If you have a project to do on your Green Space that you are not sure how to tackle, don't panic! There are lots of volunteers around the Lancaster and District area who have the skills and are happy to share them. Just get in touch !

FORK TO FORK, behind Lancaster Brewery, are a team of volunteers including people with support needs and mental health challenges, working to develop the Forest Garden. They have been coppicing and hedgelaying to provide hazel sticks to use in the garden and create dead hedges to create habitat for wildlife.



MISS WHALLEY'S FIELD - TIME CAPSULES!

The Friends group will be building a stone bench next to the memorial garden on Derwent Road. People will be able to sit and admire the Field and view towards Lancaster Castle and Morecambe Bay. It will also be a quiet spot to relax in the garden or even to wait for a bus! They will be burying 2 time capsules under the bench, one from Christchurch and one from the Gregson Community Centre. The 2 new time capsules will join the existing time capsules from 4 local schools already
