News from the Green Spaces





Uggle Lane, Scotforth, Lancaster

Local residents in Scotforth are delighted that they have a new green space and accessible footpath on their doorstep. The footpath, which runs between the A6 Scotforth Road and Lawson's Bridge over the railway,

links to Uggle Lane and is part of a well-loved walking route that was particularly well used during lockdown. The path also has some interesting history because the trees along the path had been planted as part of a scheme to raise funds for tree-planting in Africa approximately 30 years ago.

The idea for improvements came about from residents because the path became extremely muddy and almost inaccessible whenever it rained. So, thanks to funding secured from financial contributions from developers through the planning process, and support from local councillors, the footpath has been resurfaced. Other



improvements have also been made so that pedestrians can now access a beautiful tree-lined shortcut route to avoid walking along the A6.

Because of the creation of this "Place for Nature" (including a seating area, the addition of wildlife habitats and the possibility of many more improvements), a Friends group has formed - "Uggle Lane Friends" - to keep a watchful eye on the area. While still an informal group at present, the group are looking to work with other groups to make space for community composting; to plant some fruit trees and wild flowers and to protect the wild spaces already used by hedgehogs, owls, bats and other wildlife.

Dorrington Woods and Play Park, Scotforth, Lancaster



The 16th Lancaster Beaver Groups have been a great help this summer. One group weeded the trees in St Paul's School Field and the second cleaned the play equipment in the Park. They were all brilliant workers and tackled jobs that the very small Friends group could never have done.

St Paul's School Year 6 used the woods for their promenade production of Midsummer Night's Dream. It was an amazing evening and they used the woods to give the best effect, with fairies jumping out from behind trees. It rained but that did not put the performers off. Well done!



Greaves Park, Greaves Road, Lancaster

The Friends of Greaves Park ran an afternoon of wildlife activities for pupils of Bowerham Primary School. The groups got up close to wildflowers, trees, insects and a bird's nest. Claver Hill, Ridge Lane, Lancaster

The new accessible nature trail and accessible compost toilet are now open. The Open Day was a great success with about 200 visitors enjoying cream teas and cakes, purchasing preserves and apple juice, and discovering nature on the new path and nature trail.



Claver Hill will have a stall at the Seasonal Market on September 13th and at the Autumn Fiesta in St. Thomas Church Centre on November 9th. We will be selling surplus produce, calendars, and the usual preserves, juices, and vinegars. If you haven't seen the Claver Hill tapestry it will be on display at the Autumn Fiesta.

Williamson Park, Lancaster

This is our Keswick Codling, one of the 28 trees in our little orchard in Fenham Carr. The renovation of the orchard began a year ago courtesy of a grant from EMCOR with levelling of the narrow path through the site. After a year of maintenance most of the trees are bearing a good crop of apples. 4 local heritage apple saplings from the South Lakeland Orchard Group will be added this year.



The mixed hedging alongside the main path, planted last year by the Friends group, is also thriving. We are enhancing the grassland in the orchard (which had a lot of orchids in June), and Bowland View, after the grass cut, by scattering yellow rattle seed, and planting wildflower plugs. Thanks to Erica Sarney (Hermitage Community Field) for many donations of seeds and plants, and for her advice.

This autumn, we are trying to attract new volunteers, who may be busy in the week, to come along on a Sunday morning, at 10 am, to look after the Friends and Queen's Gardens, and prepare for new shrub plantings.

For volunteers who do not wish to do outdoor activities, we are offering the chance to help with our Book Sale, in the Memorial on 12/13th October. Funds from this and collecting tins in shop and café go toward maintaining the bird feeding station, and other projects.

Juice your Fruit with Share the Harvest Community harvesting activities this autumn.

Do you know of fruit trees and bushes in your area that are not getting harvested? Or do you need help with trees in your own garden or other green space? Share the Harvest is an annual harvest

festival coordinated by Food Futures. It celebrates the abundance of the season



and encourages people across North Lancashire to come together to harvest, juice, preserve and enjoy apples and other seasonal fruit. Support is available in the form of harvesting tools (including extendable apple pickers!) that can be borrowed, a mobile apple press for events, and even small grants to cover costs of community events. Harvested fruit can be donated to Eggcup and used in juicing and preserving workshops.
