Behavioural and Emotional Outcomes in Neurodevelopmental Disorders (BEOND)

What is the study about?

We want to collect information about changes in behaviour, emotion, physical and mental health for people with intellectual disabilities and / or rare genetic syndromes. This is so we can understand the impact of these experiences and hopefully offer better ideas of support.

Who can take part?

You can take part if you are a parent or carer of somebody who is:

- 1) Aged 1 year or older, AND
- 2) Diagnosed with an intellectual disability and/or a genetic syndrome associated with intellectual disability.

What will you ask me?

We will ask you to complete a range of questionnaires that will ask you about topics such as the person you care for's diagnosis, health, behaviour, and mood. We expect these questions will take you 60 minutes to complete. You don't need to answer them all in one sitting. We may also ask to do a phone interview with you.

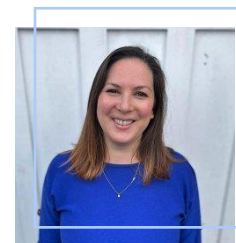

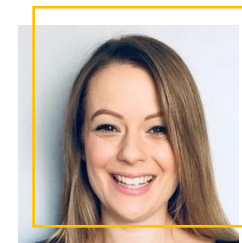
